## 1. To receive Apologies for absence

3. **Public Participation (10 minutes)** – an opportunity for parishioners to briefly raise matters of concern and hear from County and District Councillors

One member of the public sent in a message via a counsellor – Wanted to thank councillors for the tree planting, above and beyond. Question about general parish updates on website, can see some pages are out of date, who do groups and organisations advise to make sure updated? Clerk advised does check on regular basis and reaches out to organisations to check everything is correct, but if anyone notices something amiss or needs information changed or added, do let the clerk know and she will ensure updated.

Cllr Andew Reid – Newsletter received ahead of meeting, shared with councillors and added to website, Cllr AnRe spoke about newsletter, does try to concentrate on local area, but wanted to highlight the following: -

County wide: the archives for the Suffolk Regiment have now been housed in the Suffolk Museum in Bury St Edmunds, making them more accessible, should be proud of their 270-year history

Loss of Nationwide grant for rural communities, for all shire counties, was introduce in 2016 to help councils support in sparsely populated areas, such as The Peninsula, money has been re-allocated to more urban areas with high areas of deprivation.

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Suffolk Economic Strategy - devised by Suffolk Business Board with local businesses, taking a 20-year view, looking at things that can be done to increase the economy in Suffolk, more jobs and significant increase in average wages, Suffolk currently has a low average wage compared to the rest of the UK.

A new book, Lordship and Landscape in East Anglia AD 400–800, released this week, written with grant money, from The Leverhulme Trust, following the significant Anglo-Saxon find in Rendlesham, with links to Suffolk Hoo. Newsletters and updates can be found online for works that are happening across Suffolk.

Trading Standards Suffolk, hosts National Intelligence team and imports team at Felixstowe, feel achieve higher than national average of finds, see a lot of dangerous and sub-standard goods coming through.

Devolution - Government has invited Suffolk and Norfolk to become a combined authority, made up of unity authorities, government will be doing this nationwide, will mean amalgamating two of governments three tiers, abolishing county, district and borough councils, making one council, parish and town remaining same. Doing because feel by simplifying structure will make savings. What does it mean for Suffolk? Have been invited to go forward for devolution priority programme, which will mean will be able to create unitary authority and elect a mayor, who will oversee large strategic works e.g. highways, buses. Debated at County Council two weeks ago and have put council forward, believe will have more say at this stage than further down the line. Government have said if in priority programme they may consider postponing the elections in May this year, which will save the cost of having two elections. Question: are they looking to cut the number of councillors? Currently there are 75 councillors at county and 55 district councillors, if unitary, may be 130-140 councillors, may mean less people and possibly less representation. Question: What kind of area is a unitary authority? Government will consider in priority programme populations 500K to a million. Suffolk has roughly 775K people, however Ipswich borough council is too small to be on their own, but would prefer, so may consider part of East Suffolk to join, problem is if you fragment it, the less effective the savings will be. Question: How will it impact the ICB, as it currently stands? Not sure yet, they are already set up, may continue arrangements as they are, does not have to be along county boundaries. Cllr noted that already some police forces have integrated, Suffolk and Norfolk, Devon and Cornwall for instance. If do get on programme and cancel elections, then will be hearing more about via SALC, who have a dedicated page on their website and through councillors. Question: Will parish councillors be consulted? No, nor will county and district councillors, government have stated no consultation, but engagement will happen.

Cllr James Mallinder – Newsletter received ahead of meeting, shared with councillors and added to website, Cllr JaMa highlighted -

Parking patrols at the Quay are making an impact, will continue to monitor, feel people are noticing if they overstay or park in the wrong place will receive a fine.

ESC voted against the license for Jet Skis on the Deben. People can use Jet ski's personally but not set up a business. Cllr AnRe advised he attended the meeting and reported ESC had 377 responses, the biggest number ever received for a public consultation, 77% of which outrightly rejected the application.

Disappointed ESC is increasing the cost of Green Bins, disposal of Large Items, Car Parking (mainly seaside towns), and at the same time increasing councillor's allowances, costing the council £66,000. ESC is also going ahead with the changes to the bin

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collection, which will mean more household sorting of waste and kerb side collections, e.g. bottles.

Will be looking to have a unitary council in Suffolk, meaning in about 18 months will probably be no East Suffolk council, Cllr Andrew Reid will not be standing at the elections in May, if they go ahead, Cllr James Mallinder will be standing instead as a county council candidate. Will be a different way of working and may not see councillors as much, due to bigger area covering.

Enabling Community Grant budget available from Cllt JaMa, can be used for example, bins, defib or for community events, complete application and send through to Cllr JaMa. Cllr SuTa suggested a new bin for dogs, near by the school, East Lane, Clerk to look into.

Key for the School - Will update before next meeting

**Gradient at the path at Manor Farm –** Cllr AnRo to write to Orwell Housing, very slippy when icy, path is not adopted.

Cliff Erosion at PGL – Due to start work this year, only doing work on North End.

**East Lane Flooding** – Cllr AnRo to write to Cllr AnRe to ask what plans they have for when work goes ahead.

**Speedwatch** – Putting a solar panel on existing SID has now been disregarded, due to cost and will look to purchase two new SID's with the CIL funds. Cllr AnRo has managed to obtain two estimates from companies, Elan City £3100.00, not sure what is included, quote only landed in inbox before meeting, 2 year warranty, need to go back to them, quote from Westcote, £4600, 6 year warranty, Cllr RoTh to telephone organisations to

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speak direct with them and establish exactly what they are offering and the cost, will bring back to next meeting. Clerk to email Hollesley clerk and ask about their new SID, who supplied and cost.

- Another letter needs to be drafted for people who need significant work on hedges by Cllr AnRo
- SID costings to be obtained by Cllr RoTh
- Contractors' quotes to be obtained for hedging work and edges of road clearance by Cllr RoTh
- Clerk to send draft plan to ESC CIL for them to review and comment
- Draft plan to be added to website by clerk

Another walk around to be done when clocks go forward and location of hedges put on plan, along with signs and road markings and Suffolk Highways contractor to be contacted, to confirm highways boundaries.

### 8. Discuss financial support for De-fib at Shingle Street

Shingle Street are looking to install a Defib in the phone box, Clerk has forwarded grant details for British Heart Foundation who are looking to supply defibs for free, will need to purchase a battery every 5 years and pads every 3 years, would like council to support with this funding in the future, cost approx. £250 for batteries and £100 for pads, making it annual commitment of £84.00, based on the current prices

Future funding agreed, proposed by Cllr RoTh, seconded by Cllr AnRo, all in agreement
