#### **ROAD CLOSURES**

**Ford Hill, Shottisham** will be closed for bridge repairs from 8.00am-5.00pm on Friday 3 October. The diversion will be B1083 Woodbridge Road, Hollesley Road, Alderton Road, Fox Hill, The Street, Woodbridge Road, Heath Road, Sutton Road, Woodbridge Airfield Road, The Walks, B1083, Main Road and vice versa.

**Melton and Ufford Rail Crossings** will both be closed in October for major upgrades to track and level crossing infrastructure. The level crossing closures overlap and also coincide with the local half-term holidays to minimise disruption to the school bus services. The dates are:

Melton Rail Crossing 22.00hrs Friday 24 October to 06:00hrs Wednesday 29 October Ufford Rail Crossing 00.01hrs Saturday 25 October to 06.10hrs Monday 3 November There will be no access for any vehicles or pedestrians during these closures, however, there will be access for emergency vehicles across both level crossings. Work will be carried out 24/7, to ensure it is completed as swiftly as possible. All traffic on the Deben Peninsula and from Bromeswell, Eyke, Rendlesham and Tunstall, will be diverted via the A1152 through Tunstall and the B1078 via Campsea Ashe onto the A12, to reach Woodbridge and beyond, for the weekend of 24 October and into the following week.
