PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

Road Works along Ferry Road, Bawdsey Quay: Suffolk County Council will be undertaking Parking Restriction and Verge Protection Works around the Quay area on Ferry Road for a period of three - four weeks starting on 20 March.

The works will involve the installation of bollards to prevent excess parking, repairs and reinstatement to damaged verge areas, installation of four new drainage gullies, and provision of new public seating facilities along the river frontage. Access for pedestrians and vehicles will be available throughout the works but restricted at times for safety reasons.

Hedges and Trees – Overgrowing on Public Highways: It has been bought to the Parish Council's attention that some hedges are encroaching on the roads, paths and verges. The Parish Council would like to remind villagers it is the responsibility of the property and/or land owner to arrange for these to be cut back, ensuring people using the roads and pavements are kept safe from harm.

Emergency Kits: The Emergency Planning Committee has a limited number of emergency kits available for free. If you are interested, then you can collect one when the Jumble Sale is on in the Village Hall on 1 April 2023, 2.00pm.

Fake Parking Tickets: A resident of Hollesley recently received a fake parking ticket, which was left on their windscreen at Campsea Ashe. These tickets can easily be purchased online. If you receive a ticket, please ensure it is from a genuine authority before paying it.

SERVING THE COMMUNITY

Five of Bawdsey's longest standing Councillors will sadly be stepping down from the Parish Council at the end of their term in office. With a combined service of well over 30 years between them, Brian Johnson, Andrew Block, Richard Tricker, Chris Mann and Rob Johnson will all be leaving the council at the end of April. In spite of leading busy lives and in some cases still working full time, each one has brought their own interests and knowledge to the role of parish councillor, contributing in different ways and giving direction and balance to the village. Over the past 15 years Brian has held various positions as Chair, Vice Chair and Councillor at different times. As an Architect, he has brought valuable professionalism, knowledge and focus to the council's involvement in the planning process. He has also represented the council on Bawdsey Coastal Partnership which aims to understand the challenges of living on the coast. As a long-standing resident of Shingle Street, he has been a member of the Alde and Ore Association and has brought to the council's attention the various concerns and interests of the area over many years.

Andrew, a long-standing resident of Bawdsey (and Alderton), has served on the Council in positions of both Chair and Vice Chair over the past 6 years, in particular throughout the difficult period of Covid. Andrew has also represented the Council on Bawdsey Coastal Partnership and has been a key instigator in the development of the Deben Marine Centre as well as in all matters Deben-related. He has also been a council representative on the local Community Land Trust which has ensured that four of the houses at Forester's Glade, the development at School Meadow, will be for local residents at affordable rents. Andrew has also fought hard over recent years to get Parking Control measures for safer visitor access around the Quay, the works for which are now about to be put in place. Richard Tricker, while Councillor for the past 8 years has also served on the Village Hall and Recreation Ground Committee, acted as Tree Warden and along with Andrew Block has been central in the setting up of the Deben Marine Centre. Richard's supreme practical skills have meant that he was able to coordinate and implement the very successful Photo Post Project and provide the lead to the Coastal Erosion Measurement Monitoring Group. Throughout the construction phase of Scottish Power's "East Anglia One" Landfall Tunnelling Project, Richard actively represented the village's interests and continued afterwards to ensure that hedges were reinstated along Ferry Road.

Chris Mann has served us on the Council for the past 8 years, and as a principal landowner and local farmer, has provided invaluable input on environmental & highways matters, along with ever practical perspectives on the changing needs and operational challenges of agriculture in the Parish.

Rob Johnson has served as Councillor over the past 4 years as well as serving on the Village Hall & Recreation Ground Committee. He has been running the Speedwatch programme and monitoring the speed of vehicles with the SID (speed monitoring device). He also took the lead on the Emergency Planning Committee. Rob has also brought a wealth of IT skills /experience to the Council and has organised the ever popular and much needed "Pop up Pub" events.

NEW STYLE POLL CARDS ON THE WAY

East Suffolk residents who have registered to vote will begin to receive their poll cards for the forthcoming local elections in the next few days – and they will look a little different this time.

With photographic ID now required at polling stations, it is important that everyone is aware of the new rules and, with this in mind, poll cards have been amended to carry the information that people will need to ensure they can vote. The cards will be larger and, for the first time, will be delivered in a white envelope, with the words 'Official Poll Card' on the front.

If you are registered to vote, you will receive your poll cards for the local elections which take place on 4 May. If you have yet to register, the deadline to do so is 11:59pm on Monday 17 April.

You must take appropriate photographic ID with you to vote on 4 May. If you are voting by post, photo ID is not required.

ACCEPTED FORMS OF PHOTOGRAPHIC VOTER ID

A voter must present one of the following forms of photographic identification in order to vote in person at a polling station:

- A passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country
- A driving licence issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or an EEA state
- A biometric immigration document
- An identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card)
- Ministry of Defence Form 90 (Defence Identity Card)
- A Blue Badge
- A national identity card issued by an EEA state
- An Older Person's Bus Pass
- A Disabled Person's Bus Pass
- An Oyster 60+ Card
- A Freedom Pass
- A Scottish National Entitlement Card issued in Scotland
- A 60 and Over Welsh Concessionary Travel Card issued in Wales
- A Disabled Person's Welsh Concessionary Travel Card issued in Wales
- A Senior SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- A Registered Blind SmartPass or Blind Person's SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- A War Disablement SmartPass or War Disabled SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- A 60+ SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- A Half Fare SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- An Electoral Identity Card issued in Northern Ireland
- A Voter Authority Certificate or a temporary Voter Authority Certificate If your photo ID has expired, it will still be accepted as long as the photograph is still a good likeness of you.

Get free photo ID for voting - If you do not have any of the accepted forms of photo ID, you will be able to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate in person, by post or online.
