A MESSAGE FROM PGL, NEW OWNERS OF BAWDSEY MANOR

We are delighted to add such a beautiful and historic building as Bawdsey Manor to our portfolio. We were very pleased to meet some of our nearest neighbours this week and we look forward to being part of the community.

We plan, as at other PGL centres, to operate a residential outdoor education centre for schools and to operate summer camps and EFL programmes in the school holidays. There is a lot more information about what we do on our website www.pgl.co.uk.

Several of our senior staff have made an initial visit to the centre recently so that we can start to make decisions over the next few weeks.

We will welcome guests this year from June – September and then we plan to close over the winter to refurbish the interior of the accommodation blocks and carry out other work. Once we are clear what this involves, we will share our plans, but at this stage there is still a lot to be decided whilst we familiarise ourselves with the property.

We intend to create about 100 jobs - including management, maintenance, grounds work, cooks, housekeepers and activity instructors.

OPEN THE BAG AND LOOK INSIDE

A new campaign launched by the NHS is encouraging people who get prescription medicines to "Open the Bag" at the pharmacy counter or in front of the delivery driver and hand back anything they don't need. The average prescription cost overall is quoted at £41.25, which takes into account some very expensive medicines of course but it certainly makes you think. It is estimated that the cost of wasted medicine annually is £2.1 million in east Suffolk alone, of which £780,000 is returned to pharmacies but cannot be re-used. Safe disposal also costs tens of thousands of pounds. What an absolutely appalling waste!

Did you know that once you've taken prescription medicine away from the pharmacy or from the delivery driver it cannot be used by anyone else, even if the packet is unopened. If it is handed back straight away before leaving the premises it can be dispensed again by the pharmacist. As well as opening the bag, there are other actions you can take to help save money. Do not tick the boxes on your repeat prescription form for any medicines you don't need and don't be afraid to say that you've stopped taking your repeat medicine. With the NHS facing continued financial pressures these small steps could make a really big difference and ensure that this money can be better spent on patient care rather than being wasted.

The Peninsula Practice surgery holds a variety of over-the-counter medications for many common ailments. If you are feeling under the weather there is no need to go all the way into town. If you do need a repeat prescription, please use the drop-in boxes at the surgeries or the online service rather than telephoning – this reduces errors and is safer for patients. Do remember however, that prescriptions are collected from Hollesley only on Mondays and Thursdays.

DIABETES CARE IN SUFFOLK - DO YOU KNOW YOUR FOOT HEALTH RISK?

Healthwatch Suffolk is putting feet in focus with the launch of its latest research report. It has worked closely with a leading clinician to explore the views of local patients about their experiences of accessing diabetic foot care in the county.

Figures from Diabetes UK indicate that over 100 diabetes-related foot amputations occur every week in England. Patients with diabetes should receive an annual foot examination to determine whether their foot sensation is intact and their blood supply to the feet is good but this does not always happen.

Key findings: 32% of the respondents stated that they were not told about their risk of developing a diabetic foot problem in the future during their last appointment. 43% of respondents were not told what they should do if a new foot problem had developed. 28% of respondents said they were not given advice about how to look after their feet.

Three things that people said could be improved about their care:

- Ensuring people are informed about the importance of maintaining foot health and their risk of developing complications.
- Improving the availability of information regarding foot health.
- Offer more regular foot health checks.

An early outcome from the project will see patients across the East of England receiving a new information card following their annual health check. The passport, which will be roughly the size of a bank card, will be carried by patients at all times and include information about what to look for in terms of their foot health and who they should contact if they have concerns.
