BIO-DIVERSITY AT SHINGLE STREET

NEWS FROM HABSS

There are now three Public Access Defibrillators in the local area. One has recently been installed outside the Shepherd and Dog in Hollesley, joining those at Bawdsey Village Hall and the Bawdsey Manor gatehouse. Twenty-six people learned how to use them on courses in Bawdsey run by HABSS in March and April and there was also a course in Hollesley in May. We'll run another course in Bawdsey in the autumn. If you'd like to do more to help local people in medical emergencies, you could train as a Community First Responder (three day course) and join the HABSS team. PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Mid-April-mid-May is a busy time in the Council's calendar including the Annual Parish Meeting (APM) and the Annual General Meeting (AGM). The APM is a review looking back over the previous year, as reported last time. The AGM is mainly a business meeting in which a Chairman is elected and the Council looks ahead. Brian Johnson was re-elected as Chairman. Agreement was made on the composition of sub-committees and working groups. An Internal Auditor was appointed and standing orders and financial regulations were confirmed.

There was one vacancy on the Council following the resignation of Tony Osmanski. Andrew Block offered himself for co-option. The Council was pleased to welcome him and he was formally co-opted. Following approval of the Council's Business Plan for the Bawdsey Quay Visitor Centre, reported last month, Council agreed to adopt the Working Group's recommendations passing the following proposals: 1. To enter into contracts for the installation of water and sewage systems as a licensee to SCDC, 2. To make grant applications for funding building works, 3. To enter into contracts to build the café/visitor centre subject to available grant funding. This marks the start of the construction stage of the Visitor Centre. A licence from SCDC to allow BCP to proceed with building work on the site is currently being negotiated. Draft minutes of the AGM will be posted on the website from the beginning of June. 2016–17 will be a busy year in the Parish - Building work, the anticipated construction of the BQVC, restoration of the Radar Museum and start of installation of underground cables serving East Anglia One Windfarm.
