PLEASE BY ON YOUR GUARD

A truck has been seen in the early hours of the morning on several occasions, at monthly intervals, about 3.30 am. It seems to stop outside some properties before moving away. There may be a simple explanation, but in view of the spate of burglaries earlier in the year it has been reported to the police.

YOUR RUBBISH

Ever wondered what happens to your grey-bin rubbish when it's collected? Well it's taken to Suffolk's *Energy*, a waste facility in Great Blakenham. Each year 269,000 tonnes of non-recyclable waste is processed there together with some from Norfolk. All of which would have previously gone to landfill.

Your rubbish is deposited into the Bunker – which can hold up to six days' worth of waste – before being mixed and traveling to the incinerator. Heat from the burning waste is turned into steam which generates electricity. Approximately 20 megawatts is exported to the National Grid – enough to power 40,000 homes. This energy will save the taxpayer £350 million over 25 years.

Emissions are closely controlled with a dedicated cleaning process using carbon, salt and lime which neutralises the pollutants. Solid particles remaining – about 2% after incineration – are transported in sealed containers to specialist landfill. Ash is taken to an on-site building to remove metals which are recycled and the remainder graded by size and used in building projects and even building roads. So next time you see the bin boys tipping your grey-bin rubbish into the lorry you'll have some idea of what's happening to it. (Source ZWNow Issue 4 pp12–13)
