THE CRICKET SCORING HUT

This modest structure, which has stood on the recreation ground for over 100 years, was an integral part of Bawdsey Cricket Club. It was donated to BCC in 1922 by Colonel Frank Penn of Bawdsey Hall who had played county cricket for Kent. Though small, the hut was just large enough for the home team to kit up in and the hooks can still be seen on the back wall. The score board together with the individual numbers used to flag up the runs of the players are still in place. Looking through the wide window, Liz Mark, as a regular scorer, remembers having a bird's eye view of the game. The hut holds therefore many fond memories of exciting cricket matches over almost a century. But sadly it has had its day and its asbestos roof means it will have to be carefully dismantled, much missed by those who played an active part in the cricket club. Hopefully a place for the actual score board can be found in the village. Photos of the score hut will be put on the village website.
