Letter From Rev'd Ruth

Dear Friends

'Let's celebrate' was the title of our recent flower festival at All Saints' Church, Sutton, and what a wonderful celebration of talent and ingenuity it was! It was preceded by another very successful and enjoyable flower festival at Bawdsey, despite the disappointing weather conditions which meant people were unable to go up the tower on Saturday. But the rain is making our crops and gardens grow and there is plenty to celebrate. In particular, we are celebrating the award to Boyton Church and Village Hall of a **silver Eco-Church certificate**. Eco Church is an A Rocha UK project, run in partnership with Christian Aid, The Church of England, The Methodist Church and Tearfund. The questionnaire explores actions and attitudes in five key areas of church life: Worship and teaching; Management of church buildings; Management of church land; Community and global engagement; Lifestyle. In order to qualify for an Award the church must attain at least bronze, silver or gold in all of those areas. On 30 June everyone is invited to Boyton church at 10.00am to a celebration communion service where guest speaker, Simon Brown, from A Rocha who will present the award certificate. Other churches are applying for this accreditation which underlines our commitment to caring for our environment.

The following Sunday, 7 July there will be a **Songs of Praise at Alderton Church** at 3.00pm, followed by refreshments. 'Peace' is our theme and 'Rolls of Honour' naming all those who served in the First World War will be dedicated and presented to all seven parishes of the Deben peninsula.

Finally, you may have heard on the 'grapevine' that I will be retiring from being vicar of these seven parishes in February of next year. By making this public now, I hope we will all have time to make plans for the future so that our church communities can continue to flourish and be a blessing to the community as a whole. Michael and I will be moving back to Essex but hope to be frequent visitors to the area and people we love so much.

The Shoreline Management Plan - Update on Phase 1 of the Review

As part of the Client Steering Group involved with the review of the management of our coast, in particular East Lane Point, representatives from Bawdsey Parish Council and Bawdsey Coastal Partnership have had three meetings with the consultants, Jacobs UK, the Environment Agency and the District Council. The first of these was an introductory look at the state of the coast and defences at East Lane and Shingle Street. In two further meetings there was a chance to discuss, question and respond to the detailed draft report from the consultants. (There was a feeling that generally the consultants had done a thorough job, and given a clear explanation of their conclusions. They describe Bawdsey as having 'an extremely dynamic coastal environment'.)

Now the process has moved on to the point where the consultants' findings and report have been presented to the Coastal Forum, the body with the decision making powers in this review process.

The complexity of the processes affecting our coast – such as wind, tides, sea level rise, the movement of shingle, as well as economic and environmental concerns – has meant that the Coastal Forum has accepted that there are 'significant uncertainties that remain' after the first Phase, and that further detailed investigations are necessary before a decision on the best option for our coast can be reached.

Therefore, assuming that the necessary funding is made available, a second Phase will be embarked on, to work through questions and consider the options still remaining from the first Phase; the outcome of this stage will in due course be put to the Coastal Forum for their decision.

NEWS FROM BAWDSEY RADAR

Bawdsey Radar re-opened for the summer in April and has been a hive of activity so far. We welcomed our two new heritage lottery funded Interns, Emily and Nick, both of whom are studying at local Universities alongside their work at Bawdsey. Their work will include day to day operations of the attraction, welcoming visitors, and behind the scenes work on the museum's collection and programmes for local school and group visits.

We have already played host to several group visits including a Soviet Car club, various groups from the University of the 3rd Age (U3A), and some local historical societies. In early June we also hosted visits from school groups staying at Bawdsey Manor on residential trips helping them to understand the role that the Manor and the Transmitter Block played in the development of Radar and the Second World War.

This year will also be seeing a series of Heritage Lottery funded special events and upcoming in July we have "Wartime at RAF Bawdsey", "See and be Seen – Radar's use in Navigation and Search and Rescue", and a special Enthusiasts Day with a talk from Dr Phil Judkin about the use of radar in deception in the run up to D-Day. Also starting this month, the Transmitter Block will be opening for an extra day, adding Wednesday to our current opening days of Thursday, Sunday and Bank Holiday Mondays. This is down to our ace volunteers who are offering us more of their free time. If you would like to help us volunteer at the museum please let us know. We are always looking for more friendly faces to be part of the team.
