PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Speeding Issues: At the last PC meeting, the council agreed to purchase a SID device and to join the local Speedwatch initiative. The latter is being coordinated by Rob Johnson of Tailor's House. SCC Highways and the Police have to approve sites for the SID but it is hoped it will be operational by July. This will be paid for by locality grants from SCDC and SCC councillors and a generous donation from PGL. These measures are seen as educational rather than punitive and it is hoped they will help to counter speeding in the village. There are still a few dustbin stickers available. A succession of reminders every Thursday does help.

Casual Vacancy: Following the resignation of Susan Temple, there is a vacancy on the parish council. Letter from Nikki Berry - Road works in Ferry Road – 11 to 20 June 2018

We previously wrote to you informing you of a full road closure under a TO15 traffic management system. However, to enable access to be maintained on Ferry Road during the works, we will first install two temporary passing bays either side of the road. The passing bays will be installed from 11 June and work will take about one week to complete. Thereafter contractors will begin trenching work across Ferry Road to install the ducts. During this period, there will be a lane closure on Ferry Road controlled by traffic lights. Traffic will be diverted along one temporary bay while contractors work on a section of Ferry Road. As work progresses, the diversion will be switched over to the second passing bay to allow the team to continue excavating the road. The trenches will be backfilled and the road resurfaced before being re-opened to the travelling public. There will now be no full closure of the Ferry Road and it is expected to be back in normal use by 20 June. I apologise for any inconvenience. Please contact me if you have any questions.
