BAWDSEY SCHOOL UPDATE

Bawdsey school has had a great February. We have learnt a lot about online safety with Safer Internet Day and for Children's Mental Health Week we learnt different techniques to help with our mental health, including mindfulness, breathing techniques and physical activities.
