CONNECTING COMMUNITIES CHANGES

From 20 February, Connecting Communities (South) will no longer serve Martlesham Tesco, Martlesham Park & Ride or Campsea Ashe Train Station. Connecting Communities booking staff will be happy to advise passengers on alternative bus services from Woodbridge to Martlesham or alternatively the Woodbridge Dial-a-Ride service. Connecting Communities is a demand responsive bus service which has no scheduled timetable, the service is pre-bookable with pick-up points being from bus stops or designated agreed stops but not home addresses. If a passenger requires a home pick up due to mobility or frailty they need to inform the booking staff - bus passes will not be eligible on these journeys.

COULD YOU BE A 'TRANQUILITY' VOLUNTEER?

When local residents and visitors were asked what they valued about the Deben Estuary, people highlighted the sense of 'peace and tranquillity' that the area gave them. This emphasis on 'tranquillity' was referred to in the Deben Estuary Plan and now further work to define what is meant by a 'tranquil' area is being undertaken. A map, using available desk-based data, has set out the generally quiet or busy areas. The next stage is to ask volunteers to go to designated places and, using a list of criteria (eg traffic noise, bird song, sight of housing), log what they see, hear and experience. These checks will be carried out at different times of day at given points during the year. This is an important piece of work which should provide a new insight into an area we value highly. NOT MADE TO MEASURE – BUT VOLUNTEERING!

Anybody who regularly walks the beach at Bawdsey Quay will have seen the extraordinary changes that take place in the banks of shingle. At the request of the Environment Agency and SCDC's Coastal Team, a small group of volunteers have been measuring these changes. They have been recording the changes in beach levels below Bawdsey Manor (where the sheet piling is) and along the estuary mouth between the Quay and the Knolls. Measurements are taken every week and the data is proving very important in assessing how the coast should be managed in the future. Measuring takes about an hour at low tide. At present four people share the task – Richard Tricker (who leads the team), Vic Clouting, Andrew Block and Colin Hind. More helpers would be very welcome.
