STAY SAFE ON OUR COAST!

We need your help to make sure that everyone stays safe when they visit the beach. **Do stay away from cliffs.** They can be very unstable even if they look safe. It is extremely dangerous to walk close to cliffs or to climb them.

Do take notice of any signs warning you of hazards. These have been put in place to help keep you and your loved ones safe.

Do take notice of the tides. Some areas of beach along our coast are not as wide as they used to be and at high tide it is not possible to walk along them without walking close to the cliffs or being cut off by the tides. This could be very dangerous if the cliff is unstable, even though it may look safe.

Don't walk on any defences which have been placed on the beach. Not only is it dangerous to do so, you are damaging something which is there to help protect the local community from erosion.

Do follow any diversion signs. That help you navigate your walk onto safe paths and areas until you have passed any hazards.
