ACROSS THE RIVER

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

PSPO consultation: BPC has responded to the Public Space Protection Orders consultation which proposes prohibiting dogs off leads on the beach at Bawdsey, by asking for a longer consultation period to allow the council to receive more detailed information about nesting birds and their habitats from the experts at the RSPB and Natural England.

Local crime: The Police are warning of the importance of securing property and sheds against theft following crimes at Alderton and Sutton. The public should also be aware of telephone scams which are becoming more prevalent.

Anti-Speeding measures: As an interim measure, the parish council is purchasing stickers for dustbins asking motorists to "Slow Down in Our Village." If you could use a sticker and place your bin for collection facing the traffic (in either direction), please contact the Clerk (email bawdsey-pc@hotmail.co.uk/410198). The council is subsidising the stickers but will be asking for 75p per sticker, half the cost.

Vacancy on Parish Council: Following the resignation of Mark Dovey, there is a vacancy on the parish council. The Clerk will be able to answer any questions regarding this post.

Local Plan Consultation: Issues and Options: A reminder that the consultation closing date is 30 October. SCDC has set out three potential sites for development in Bawdsey to fulfil housing needs up to 2036. Following discussion at last month's PC meeting, only one site is deemed viable, namely a stretch of land below Manor Farm Estate abutting the main road on which 11 houses are proposed. Chairman, Andrew Block, is soon to meet and will organise a drop-in session in the village hall where a copy of the full plan will be available for viewing and where parishioners can come and share their views before a formal written response is sent in to SCDC. Posters will be put up around the village when a date has been set. Alternatively you can share your thoughts with the Parish Council via the Clerk and do cc Bawdsey-pc@hotmail.co.uk into any submissions you make.

Impending closure of Woods Lane, Melton: Please note the following road closure at the top of Woods Lane which will impact anyone accessing the A12. Bloor Homes has applied for the road closure in order to connect utilities, such as gas, electricity and water to the development of 184 houses. Since the development was granted permission at appeal, it means Bloor Homes legally has the right to proceed with it. This includes Phase 1: 6 November–30 November and Phase 2: 8 January–13 April 2018. The closure will be removed throughout December as is standard procedure around the Christmas period. Diversions will be put in place but journey times will necessarily be much longer!

HEALTH MATTERS

Flu vaccination: This winter could see a high number of flu cases in the country. People in "at-risk" groups should contact their GP surgery to arrange a free flu vaccination. You are eligible for a free flu vaccination from your GP if you:

- Are aged 65 years or over
- Are pregnant
- Are a carer of an elderly/disabled person whose welfare may be at risk if you fall ill
- Are aged between six months and 65 years and have a heart problem, a chest complaint or breathing difficulties or lowered immunity due to disease, treatment or other conditions
- Are a child aged two or three, children in reception class and school years 1, 2 or 3.

If you know someone in one of these categories please remind them of the importance of protecting their health this winter.
