- Work at the landfall site for HDD* is planned to start in February and will, hopefully, complete in mid-May.
- The HDD drilling in this area is under the River Deben, the Queen's Fleet and the Landfall site. There will be no HDD under Ferry Road.
- SP will be excavating across Ferry Road to install the cable ducts.
- The latest plan is to use the HDD from 0700 to 1900hrs, 7 days a week.
 These working hours are different from all previous when we were told it
 would be 24-hours working 7 days a week. I'm sure these revised times
 will be much better for residents.
- All generators will be housed in sound-reducing enclosures and will be within permitted noise levels.
- Lighting will not be intrusive to surrounding private property. All lighting will be adjustable so that it can be focussed on the working areas and not over unnecessary wider areas.
- I was informed (Nick Rowe) that there would be a permanent vehicle
 washer on site. This will be used to wash vehicles before they return back
 onto Ferry Road. This should help reduce the need to continually sweep
 Ferry Road.

The use of a permanent road sweeper being kept on the landfall site was given by Anthony Roche at a meeting on 25 April 2017. At this meeting a large number of points were raised with Scottish Power. Keeping Ferry Road free of mud was one aspect we were re-assured about.

It is this last point that needs addressing immediately. Yesterday when I walked home there was a large quantity of mud over the road at the landfall site. This should be addressed as a matter of top priority.
